

## Westerfield Footpath Proposal, August 2024

This footpath is currently under threat of being blocked by a business park development. As such, this proposal should be investigated with the highest priority to ensure development can proceed with adequate allowances for this path. The route was set out in 1808 however it appears to have been lost at some point over the proceeding 200yrs. As a result, it does not show up on OS maps. Nonetheless, the legal ground for the route is solid and this proposal will seek to show this. The route connects with a well-used path leading to Ipswich (known as The Fonnereau Way). It will provide greater accessibility to the centre of Westerfield and promote active travel into Ipswich.
